Overview	<p>Observing the weather earlier in the day we prepared for an extremely wet and cold night and it was !! Although to be fair we were only caught in one very heavy shower spent in the main speaking to a door steward who was getting equally soaked !!</p> <p>Despite weather conditions and therefore less opportunities to engage in conversations, it was a fruitful patrol.</p>
Prayers, please:	<p><i>Please be led by the Spirit to pray into the following situations.</i></p> <p>At one of the east end pubs we engaged in conversation with a young man and his uncle. Regulars at the establishment. During our chat the uncle shared that he had experienced sadness regarding a broken relationship where his partner had become extremely aggressive and they had to part. Please pray for healing of past hurts and wounds.</p>
	<p>Making our way back to the other end of High Street we met a couple who stopped to enquire what we did and praise us for our efforts. We had a long and engaging conversation with both the gentleman and the lady. He was a submariner and the lady was retraining as a mental health nurse. The conversations led to discussion regarding church, their beliefs and how they were brought up. The lady also asked where she could donate boxes which she had made up for disadvantaged at Christmas. During conversation it was evident that a Christian seed had been planted earlier in each of their lives but at this moment in time they were unsure what to believe. SPs listened and encouraged and left them with some thoughts and some literature. Please pray that there will be situations this Christmas time for the seed which is now starting to sprout, to be nurtured to full bloom.</p>
	<p>Please pray for two gentlemen - two separate occasions, who slipped and fell on the paving. One had recently undergone surgery. He said he was fine and was able to walk. A friend assisted and took him into</p>

	<p>the nearby pub for a seat and to recover. Please pray that neither sustained major injury and for healing.</p>
	<p>Please uphold in prayer the wife of one of our night club stewards. She is expecting a baby soon but the baby is lying in an awkward position and therefore may have to be delivered sooner than expected. Her husband said she is in pain and feeling uncomfortable.</p>
	<p>At the station we came across a young man who was waiting for the next train to Edinburgh for a connection to Glasgow – he came from East Kilbride – the next train was possibly 5 am the next day !! He was unfamiliar with Kirkcaldy and walked with us for a while so that we could source a warm place for him to get something to eat and hang out for a while. There were no late buses going to Edinburgh. We enquired at a 24 hour establishment and because he was not drunk they were willing to let him hang around there. Two very kind employees offered to provide him with coffee. However he had spied two or three take aways and said he would go there first before taking up the offer.</p> <p>After our break we returned to the establishment with some rolls etc but the lady we had met said he had not come back. We looked out for him but can only assume he took refuge in one of the local establishments or found a solution to his transport problem. He appeared very sensible so there was no cause for concern. However we did pray for his safe return home.</p>
	<p>Please pray for a young lady SP met outside a night club. She had been brought up under a very strict Christian denomination and as she reached adolescence rebelled. She was now involved in behaviour which SP felt she knew to be wrong and that there was still a thread of hope.</p>
	<p>Finally a prayer for one of our door stewards, from a different religion, who has no fear of dying but from whom we felt a sense of despair.</p>
	<p>Thank you again to all who support and cover us in prayer. Despite the rain and cold, we returned to base warmed and glowing in the strength of the Lord.</p>
