



News



Ukraine

We are all watching the terrible events that started to unfold in Ukraine on the 24th February with the Russian invasion. Day by day we are watching the terrible scenes as the residents fear for their lives, spend hours in the underground stations or underground car parks. Then there are the long queues at the borders as people try to flee in to Europe to return home, travel to relatives elsewhere in Europe or just escape to safety.

There have been many collections of essential items started across the world including here in Fife. However, the organisers of many of our local collections are unable to take anymore donations due to space. We will look into how we, as a Presbytery, can work together to support Ukrainian communities locally and overseas. Fife Council have indicated that they hope to welcome families to Fife and

this will be when we can really involve every church across Fife.

In the meantime I would commend the connections made through the Faith Impact Forum to provide financial support via the Church of Scotland, to Reformed Church in Hungary Aid (RCHA), which is run by our partner, the Reformed Church of Hungary.

A letter from the Faith Impact Forum was shared with Presbytery members and Session Clerks this week and this includes details of how best to channel financial support to help those fleeing their homes.

In the meantime keep the people of Ukraine in your prayers and we pray that there is a resolution soon to allow the Ukraine communities rebuild their lives back in their home country.





Sharing Jesus is a resource designed to help people add a spiritual dimension alongside what you're already doing. It has ideas for sharing Jesus in a new worshipping community, Fresh Expression of church, missional community or church plant as well as community groups.

Over the 30+ years of pioneering new, contextual forms of church we've found that the part of the Fresh Expressions/Loving First journey people struggle with the most is introducing a spiritual element to their gatherings in a sensitive and contextual way which is why we created this resource.

Sharing Jesus adopts an open-handed, walking together, learning from one another, asking questions approach. It's not about telling people what to believe, but about saying to friends: "This is what I am finding helpful. What do you think? Might we explore this spiritual path together?" It includes seven topics, each with a video animation, a video story, and a short downloadable guide with additional ideas and explanation. The resources are arranged logically to give them a shape, but please don't

follow the order! Go to the section that most interests you.

People's Health Trust

The Active Communities programme is now open to applications if:

- Your organisation supports people to create or shape local projects that will help their community or neighbourhood to become even better
- You are a not for profit organisation or group (for a full list of eligible organisations, click [here](#))
- Your income is less than £350,000 a year, or an average of £350,000 or less over the last two years
- You have less than six months' annual running costs in savings (with no restrictions on the money) after you have deducted the grant you wish to request from us
- Your organisation has been constituted for at least three months

The National Lottery Community Fund Improving Lives

The National Lottery Community Fund's Improving Lives programme is open to voluntary or community organisations. The programme aims to help people facing challenging circumstances especially activities that mean

people:

are better able to identify ways to take control over their lives and build resilience:

- are able to shape the activities and services they use to better meet their needs
- have more access to support and opportunities to improve their lives

The grants range from £10,001 to £200,000.

Bank of Scotland Foundation Reach

Apply for funding of between £1,000-£25,000 over one year.

Funds can be used for many charitable purposes but not solely to advance religion. The fund opens on 7 March and closes again on 17 March.

AllChurches Trust

AllChurches Trust like to fund projects that demonstrate an impact on people and communities. Applicants should include clear (and where possible, measurable) outcomes for projects and demonstrate how they will ensure sustainability beyond our funding. It's also important to show how additional funding support will be sought to enable the project to be completed.

Our open grants normally fund capital projects and equipment, not salaries or running costs, with the exception of our transformational and Hope Beyond programmes. In most cases, we give a small percentage of the project cost as this enables us to say yes to more worthwhile causes, although we do occasionally give larger grants.

Churches and chapels in Scotland needing funding for urgent repairs and maintenance are being encouraged to apply for grants from the National Churches

Trust.

In 2021, the church support charity expects to allocate more than £1.5m to churches and chapels throughout the UK. Any church, chapel or meeting house in Scotland that is open for regular public worship can apply.
